1. NCVER adult literacy and numeracy research funding demise

VALBEC members may be aware that targeted adult literacy and numeracy research funding through NCVER has been cut. The implications for the ALBE field are wide ranging and both ACAL and VALBEC have sent letters of protest to Andrew Robb, Minister for Vocational and Further Education. COAG has recently cited the needs of adults with low educational skills as part of the agenda for the new wave of reforms to the VET sector. Specifically focussed research funding for adult literacy and numeracy is essential to underpin these reforms. We urge members to write to their local members and the Minister to raise this issue.
