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5. Numeracy training for the staff of the Ministry of Finance in Dili

The skills involved range from very early level arithmetic, particularly subtraction and division, through to using simple formulae. There is a major focus on concepts of fraction, decimal and percentage and on using short cut methods to calculate these, rather than the formal algorithmic approach. Training will continue until at least the end of November and possibly through next year but we are one teacher short at the moment. Adult numeracy teachers who can come for approximately two month blocks on a rotating basis to keep the training program lively and fresh for its duration are welcome. Longer stays would also be possible. Suitable teachers should have had experience working with adults and definitely some numeracy teaching experience are required. It would also help if they had worked with interpreters in the past and /or had experience teaching indigenous Australians or African refugees.
