# 4. Adult Literacy and Lifeskills Survey (ALLS)

At the end of November, the results of the Adult Literacy and Lifeskills Survey (ALLS) will be released in Australia. A similar survey was carried out in 1996 and the results showed that approximately 6.2 million adult Australians had inadequate literacy skills to cope with the demands of everyday life and work. We now have the chance to compare the situation ten years later. If Canada is any indication, the results will be similar to 1996. We have an opportunity to remind the community and the government of the levels of funding required to provide access to quality programs for all adult learners. We need to get our message out in the public arena. We know the importance of adequate literacy and numeracy skills for a healthy, productive society. We need to tell others how important it is.

In the lead up to the federal election, ACAL, VALBEC and other state organizations will be lobbying politicians to raise awareness across governments and in the wider community of the need to expand funding and provision.
